Westringia Low Horizon™ WES06 (b)

Westringia are hardy natives that have similar leaves to rosemary with small white to purple flowers. There are many forms available from groundcovers to tall shrubs with varieties that vary from variegated foliage to dark green and green-grey foliage. They are coastal tolerant and require minimal water once established.

A tough groundcover requiring minimal maintenance other than the odd prune.

A great native substitute for box hedges. Can be manicured or left unpruned it forms a dense ball shape. Mauve flowers in Spring/Summer.

Is a great native alternative to the box hedge. It is more compact than Aussie Box, with contrasting grey-green foliage and white flowers in spring. H 30-40cm x 40cm

A tough evergreen groundcover with dense foliage that layers over to cover slopes, embankments and large areas. It has many white flowers throughout Spring and Summer.
H 0.4m x 1.5m

Westringia White Rambler(b)

A dense evergreen semi-prostrate shrub with cascading foliage. Abundant white flowers are produced in spring and summer. Frost, salt and wind tolerant.

Masses of vivid blue/purple flowers appear predominately in Spring. It's dense bushy growth makes it a great native hedging alternative.
H 1.5m x 1.3m

Smokey-grey and white variegated foliage with masses of white flowers appearing through Winter and Spring. A great contrast shrub well suited to coastal areas, low hedges and playgrounds.
