CALLISTEMON RED ALERTTM Φ Compact variety with vibrant red new growth which is most vivid for two Autumn and months in Spring. Plant in full sun to part shade. Frost tolerant. Low watering requirements once established.

H 2-2.4m W 1.5-2 Unpruned H 0.5-2m W 0.4-1.5m Pruned



MURRAYA PANICULATA

Evergreen rounded shrub with rich green foliage. Masses of sweetly scented white flowers appear in Summer and spot flowering at other times. Position in full sun/part shade in moist well draining soil. Moderate water requirements.

H to 3m W 1.2-1.5m



PHOTINIA RED ROBIN

Evergreen shrub with dark green mature leaves and brilliant red new growth. Clusters of small creamy-white flowers are produced in late Spring. Frost hardy. Plant in full sun to part shade in moist well drained soil. Moderate water requirements.

H to 3m W 1.2

HEDGING PLANTS



NANDINA BLUSHTM (D)
Compact shrub with bubbly red blushing leaves for nine months of the year with main flush in Winter. Plant in full sun to part shade. Will tolerate heavier soils with reasonable drainage. Low water requirements. Water during extended dry periods.
H 60-70cm W 60m



BUSH CHRISTMAS (D)
Bushy shrub with a compact habit that can be trimmed into a dense hedge or topiary. Bronze new growth in Winter. Has edible pink berries. Position in full sun to part shade in well draining moist soil. H 2-3m W 1.5m Can be pruned much smaller

SYZYGIUM australe



RHAPHIOLEPIS SNOW MAIDEN
Dwarf compact shrub which is
excellent for low hedges.
Clusters of white flowers appear in Winter and Spring.
Slower growing, low maintenance plant. Tolerates a wide range of soil types. Low water requirements once established.
H 75cm W 50cm



VIBURNUM TINUS
Rounded evergreen shrub with dark green oval leaves. Clusters of tiny white flowers appear in late Winter, early Spring followed by blue-black berries. Tolerant of a wide range of soils and conditions. Plant in full sun to part shade. Moderately frost hardy. H 3m W 3m



SYZYGIUM ORANGE TWIST (D)
Dense shrub with small glossy dark green leaves that has contrasting vivid orange new growth. Prune to maintain hedge shape and encourage colourful new growth. Has edible magenta berries. Position in full sun to part shade in well draining moist soil. H to 3m W to 1.5m



VIBURNUM DENSE FENCETM (D)
Dense shrub that will form a 2
metre screen in 14 months
when fertilised correctly.
Bronze new growth. Prefers
well drained soil types. Plant
in full sun or part shade. Moderate watering required.
H 2.5-3m W 2m Unpruned
H1.8m when pruned
