<u>Raspberry Jam Wattle</u> is a WA native commonly found throughout the Southwest and Wheatbelt areas.

The seeds were traditionally ground into flour and used to bake small cakes. These can be collected from the ground or harvested straight from the treefollowing golden flowers in Spring. The orange gum (resin) is also edible and can be used for making tea. A great screening/windbreak attracting local fauna.

Acacia cyclops RED-EYED WATTLE

Acacia cyclops is a native found naturally along the southcoast of WA and SA. It is often planted along coastal lines to help stabilize sand dunes. The twisted seed pods are sought after as they were traditionally ground into flour for making bread.

The Red-eyed Wattle is a drought tolerant variety, salt tolerant and loves the full sun.

Acronychia oblongifolia WHITE ASPEN

White Aspen is a subtropical evergreen tree growing to 6-8m. It has dense, leathery, dark green leaves and small white flowers in Summer to Autumn. Following the flowers are green berries that turn white/yellow as they ripen. These berries can be eaten fresh or cooked and have a citrus flavour with a hint of eucalyptus and honey.

White Aspen perform best in rich, moist soils and requires protection from strong winds.

RED BACK AUSSIE GINGER

Red Back Australian Ginger is a shade loving plant with attractive green foliage with red backs. It has fragrant white flowers that appear from Spring to Summer followed by blue berries that can be eaten straight from the plant.

The ginger scented rhizome can also be eaten. This requires cooking and can be used to make savory dishes, desserts and jams.

It prefers moist soils, fertilizing in Spring and being well mulched before Summer.

Bignay is a medium tree growing to 8m. It has glossy, dark green, alternate leaves making an attractive plant. It has grape-like clusters of fruits that ripen unevenly resulting in a very colourful display. These fruit have a mildly sour taste when immature and white in colour, when left to ripen to a red/black colour it has a pleasant tart taste. Fruits can be eaten raw or used in jams. Bignay will perform in a variety of soils, benefitting from a feed 2-3 times a year with pruning carried out in Spring.

While young it will require protection from drying winds and frost.

Sea Celery is a native substitute to Celery with a salty/ocean flavour. It resembles celery in its shoots

and appearance much the same as the European form. It is drought and frost tolerant preferring a sunny position but will tolerate dappled shade.

Harvest by picking stems as required. Chop these up finely and use as a garnish on soups and dishes or blanch to mellow the strong flavours slightly.

Great for pots, in veggie patches or amongst general plants in garden beds.

Sea Parsley is a coastal native resembling Italian pars-ley. It is a hardy little grower tolerant to drought, frost, salinity and sandy soils. Plant in a full sun to lightly dappled area. Ensuring it is watered well and fertilized regularly until established it can provide a year round supply of fresh stems.

Use similarly to parsley by adding chopped sprigs to flavour dishes and salads. It can be eaten fresh or blanch the stems and eat separately.

Atriplex nummularia OLD MAN SALTBUSH

Old Man Saltbush is a fast-growing shrub previously used mostly as a grazing plant for stock. It has greygreen irregular shaped foliage 2-3cm in size that are edible and salty in flavour but rich in protein, antioxidants and minerals.

The edible leaves can be used in salads, sautéed, dried and used as a herb.

For best results, plant in full sun to part shade in rich, free draining soil and water well until established. Once established it is a hardy plant tolerating long periods of drought.

Planted in ideal conditions it can reach 3m, but is also suited to pots and with regular pruning, makes a great edible hedge/screening plant.

Atractocarpus fitzalanii NATIVE GARDENIA

The Native Gardenia is a large shrub to small tree with large, glossy, green leaves. Spring time sees fragrant blossoms of white star-shaped flowers. These develop into small brown fruits which turn yellow with maturity during Winter. The fruit is soft and sweet and can be eaten raw in salads or cooked in cakes and deserts. It prefers a sunny to lightly shaded position in moist, well drained soils. It requires protection from strong winds and harsh afternoon sun until established. H 6m W 3m 175mm

Austromyrtus dulcis **MIDYIM BERRIES**

This versatile small shrub is one of the best tasting of all the bush tucker plants. The new leaves are burgundy coloured, whilst the spring flowers appear as small white stars in early Summer. These are followed by small but sweet berries in late Summer and early Autumn.

A light trim after harvest will see you rewarded with another crop the following season. The fruit of the Midyim Berry is the native equivalent to a blueberry. This small shrub is perfect for filling in gaps and is ideal to grow in full sun or part shade. A must for any edible landscape, this is the new age box hedge.

Backhousia myrtifolia CINNAMON MYRTLE

Cinnamon Myrtle is a hardwood native tree to 6-7m in natural conditions but will keep to a more manageable 3m in home gardens. It is an attractive ornamental with glossy, green foliage and creamy/white flowers in summer. When crushed the leaves have a cinnamon fragrance. The leaves can be plucked as needed and used in curries, stews, soups, roasts, cakes and biscuits. Prefers a sunny to partly shaded position in moist, well drained soils with protection from cold winds and frosts.



NATIVE LEEK

Native Leek is a native vegetable with a sweet, starchy corm that can be eaten year-round. The grassy like foliage dies back in mid summer and the underground corm is ready for harvesting (once mature enough). If unharvested it will re-shoot again in Autumn.

A spike of bright yellow flowers occur from Septem-ber to March followed by seeds which can also be harvested. Plant in full sun to light shade in moist, loamy soils. Frost hardy.

Carpobrotus virescens **BAIN**

Karkalla is a groundcovering coastal succulent with large fleshy leaves. Brilliant fuchsia pink flowers with yellow centres appear in Spring and Summer. Following the flowers are edible grape sized fruits that are deep red in colour when ripe. The leaves are also edible and can be eaten raw or cooked like a vegetable. It has medicinal properties similar to aloe vera helping to remedy skins, burns and other skin irritations.

For best results plant in a sunny position in well drained soils.


A variety of Geraldton Wax, Jambinu Zest is ideal for culinary use with its edible needle-like leaves and waxy flowers with a Lemon Myrtle flavour. Its dark pink-crimson blooms make a wonderful display during winter and spring and can be harvested for use along with the foliage. For best results plant in a full sun to lightly shaded position in well drained soils.

Cymbopogon ambiguus NATIVE LEMONGRASS

Native Lemongrass is an aromatic grass with narrow green stalks and leaves. It flowers during Spring producing wispy seed heads.

It is a very useful herb in the garden adding delicious flavour to soups, curries and sauces. It's essential oils are found in skin care and shampoo, plus it has medicinal properties helping relieve chest congestion due to colds.

To harvest, cut leaves as needed when about 30cm and use fresh or freeze for later use.

It is drought and frost tolerant once established.

QLD DAVIDSON'S PLUM

Queensland Davidson's Plum is also known as Ooray. Ooray is a multi-trunked tree producing attractive pendulous sprays of reddish flowers with yellow stamens appearing along branches or the trunk.

The flowers are followed by large purple fruits resembling a plum which ripen between November and February. The red fleshed plums are pleasantly sour and very high in antioxidants and vitamins. It prefers moist soils and good soil nutrition. Provide protection from the full sun and wind when young. The new growth is attractive and tinged pink.

Dianella revoluta BLUEBERRY LILY

Dianella is a popular genus grown commonly in many home gardens. It is a hardy grower with a clumping habit and green strappy foliage.

Spring and Summer time sees small blue-lilac flowers sitting above the foliage on narrow stems. After flowering berries develop that can hold onto the stems for weeks.

It has small creamy coloured flowers in Summer developing into large yellow-brown bulbs in Autumn. Once ripe the bulbs split open revealing the bright red flesh underneath. These fruits can be eaten raw or cooked to make condiments.

Each tree has the potential to produce many kilos of fruit.

Round Baby Pigface is a low growing, native succulent well suited to coastal and dry areas. The round, coral like green leaves are edible and make a juicy addition to salads, stir-fries and pickles. It is a hardy grower, tolerant to drought, frost and salinity. The foliage tinges red when it's in need of a generous watering.

Pink to purple blooms are a feature during the warmer months and attract many pollinating insects and small birds.

Blue Quandong is fast growing making a wonderful shade tree. Recommended for parks and large blocks it has bright light green foliage that turns red before falling. Flowers appear abundantly from autumn through winter and develop into rounded fruits that are brilliant blue in colour.

Enchylaena tomentosa RUBY SALTBUSH

Ruby Saltbush is a succulent type plant with fleshy green leaves that are covered in fine white hairs. It has small berries that range in colour from yellow to ruby red. These berries are edible and can be eaten raw or soaked to make a tea. The leaves are also edible but should be cooked and consumed sparingly.

It is a hardy, low growing shrub that prefers full sun and well drained soils.

Ruby Saltbush is a woody plant but trimmed regularly makes an ideal hedging and screening plant.

Eupomatia laurina NATIVE GUAVA

Native Guava has pale, perfumed flowers without petals in Summer followed by urn shaped fruit. The fruit ripens in winter and are ready to eat straight from the plant when they turn from green to brown and are soft to squeeze. The pulp is a creamy colour with many small seeds, similar to other guavas.

The Native Guava grows into a large shrub or small tree. The foliage turns attractive coppery tones in the cooler weather. It benefits from mulching and additional watering in dry periods. Protect from hot dry winds.

The Sandpaper Fig is mostly found in the rainforest conditions of Queensland and New South Wales, but has been known to grow elsewhere throughout Australia. It is an attractive tree, ideal for growing as a shade tree or hedge. It's green leaves were traditionally used to polish weaponry by Aboriginals and the bark for making string. Small green fruit up to 2cm ripen to purple black colour when ready for eating.

Hibiscus sabdariffa **ROSELLA**

Rosella is a hardy plant with deeply lobed green foliage and red stems. Flowering in Autumn sees pale yellow flowers followed by bright red edible seed pods. The seeds can be roasted and ground into flour, while the young leaves can be stir-fried or steamed. The calyx as pictured above are high in Vitamin C and have a pleasant tart flavour ideal for salads, syrups and wine.

It prefers fertile, well drained soil and requires regular watering until established. Once established it can survive the occasional dry spell.

Kunzea pomifera is a dense, low growing groundcover. It has petite, bright green foliage and white flowers similar to gum blossom in Spring. Following the flowers are clusters of green berries that turn purple/red with maturity. They are crunchy in texture and can be eaten raw or cooked. They are rich in antioxidants containing 4 times the amount of blueberries.

It prefers full sun to dappled shade in well drained sandy soils. Great for pots, garden beds, gaps and works well as a living weed suppressor.



Macadamia is a popular edible nut the world over. Native to Queensland, this delicious buttery nut is fast growing and quick to fruit making it ideal for backyard gardens - room permitting of course. Preferring a sunny position in well drained soil, this ornamental can reach between 5-10m with dark green, dense foliage making it a great shade tree. River Mint is a native relative to peppermint and spearmint. It is a fast grower with fragrant, bright green oval leaves with various uses.

The leaves can be harvested as needed and used in cooking, as insect repellant and has medicinal properties.

It performs best in a shaded, moist to boggy position. If planted into garden beds and left to run, it will spread to a size up to 1m, but it is best contained and most easily grown in pots.



Mentha satureioides BUSH MINT

Bush Mint or Native Pennyroyal is a clumping, native, groundcover. It is delicate, yet fast growing with fragrant, bright green leaves with tiny white flowers in Summer.

The leaves can be harvested during the cooler months and used in salads, sauces and cooked in tea as well as making up insect repellants and used to treat cold and flu symptoms.

It performs best in a partly shaded position in moist to boggy soils.



Youlk is an edible root also known as the Ravensthorpe Radish. It is similar to a carrot rather than a radish with its crisp apple-like texture, golden colour and flavours with a hint of carrot and sweet eucalyptus.

It is an interesting ingredient when added to salads, stews & pies or simply roasted and eaten with butter and salt.

Harvest throughout the year as needed by digging down and removing tubers.

Bush Basil is a low growing shrub with soft, hairy green leaves. The leaves are fragrant, with a scent reminiscent to a cross between basil, mint and sage.

The leaves are best harvested whilst young and fresh and kept be for later use if not all required at harvesting time. Use leaves similar to basil using them fresh in salads, on pizza or make homemade pesto.

Bush Basil performs best in a full sun to partly shaded position in free draining soils with plenty of organ-ic matter.

Burdekin Plum is hardy and drought tolerant. It has dark green glossy foliage with a dark grey trunk.

It flowers during summer from January –March, producing small yellow/green flowers. These develop to produce large, round, black fruit similar to plums.

These plums can be eaten raw, cooked or fermented into wine. The fruit can be hard and acidic when picked straight from the tree, but left in storage to ripen for a few days will assist with the ripening process.


NATIVE THYME

Scaevola spinescens MAROON BUSH

The Maroon Bush is a hardy shrub to 2m with green prickly leaves. The creamy white to yellow fan shaped flowers flower throughout most of the year, developing into oval berries than turn black on maturity. It was traditionally used as a bush medicine treatment for cancer, heart disease and kidney conditions .

For best results plant in a sunny to lightly shaded position in well drained soils. Once established it will tolerate dry periods.





TUCKER BUSH CHERRY

Lilly Pilly are a well known plant that have been a favourite for gardeners and landscapers for many years. There are many varieties on the market, each with its own unique features.

This variety grows to 3-4m high if left untouched, but will make a dense, edible hedge pruned to height. It has green oval leaves that start out bronze, turning glossy and deep green as they mature. Clusters of white fluffy flowers precede the edible pink/red fruit.







Tetragonia tetragonioides WARRIGAL GREENS

Warrigal Greens is a native leafy green herb with slightly fleshy green leaves similar to English spinach. It is a sprawling ground cover to 50cm.

It can be grown as an English spinach replacement and used/eaten in the same way. By simply removing leaves as needed during the warmer months it is ideal for stir-fries, soups and as a steamed vegetable. To encourage growth, harvest regularly.

The small yellow flowers that appear in Spring and Summer are also edible.
